

## Georgian Technical University Representatives at the Second Conference of the European Erasmus Program (International Mobility Week 2019)

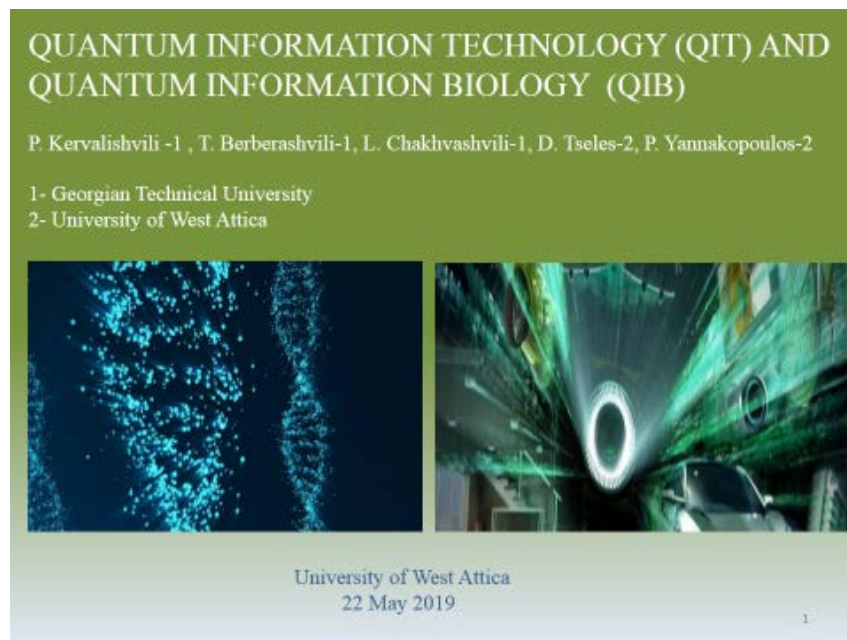
